

SCHOOL BEHAVIOR GOALS

Sherwood Park will be participating in the Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) program. Students will be taught school expectations and will be held to a high standard of behavior in the classroom and throughout the building. Throughout the building, we expect students to adhere to the BEARS matrix

- B-** Believe and Achieve
- E-** Engage in learning
- A-** Act Responsibly
- R-** Respect yourself, others and property
- S-** Safety First

AT SHERWOOD PARK, WE EXPECT ALL STUDENTS TO:

- TREAT EVERYONE WITH RESPECT AND DIGNITY (NO PROFANITY)
- ADHERE TO REQUESTS OF TEACHERS AND STAFF (ATTITUDE + EFFORT= SUCCESS)
- BE SAFE AND ORDERLY (NO FIGHTING, WALK – KEEP TO THE RIGHT)
- TAKE RESPONSIBLITLY FOR LEARNING (EFFORT, ATTENDANCE/ ON TIME, READY, MATERIALS)

The school-wide behavior plan will be in effect on the first day of school. Students will be expected to follow the procedures and policies set forth. Consequences will be applied to any student who fails to do so, as follows:

CONSEQUENCES

All students will begin each day on “Green” on the classroom behavior chart, with the opportunity to earn a “doctorate degree” (pink – Master’s Degree/purple – Ph.D.) by exemplifying good character traits.

Consequences:

- First Offense – Stop and think (blue)
- Second offense – Written reflection (yellow)
- Third offense – Advisor contact (Parent Phone Call) (orange)
- Fourth offense – As deemed appropriate by the teacher, i.e. loss of privilege such as silent lunch, or office referrals (red)

Under no circumstances will recess, or loss thereof, be used as a consequence for classroom behaviors.

SHERWOOD PARK’S CELL PHONE POLICY

We want to continue our efforts to provide children at Sherwood Park Elementary School with an environment that is safe and secure. In some cases, parents have allowed children to carry cell phones for safety reasons. Following is our policy on cell phone use to which we will adhere in the event your child has your permission to have a cell phone during the school day.

- Students will keep cell phones in a backpack during the school day and will not turn them on until they are released from the school bus or until after the 2:20 p.m. bell.
- If students stay on campus for an after-school activity, the cell phone will remain off and in the backpack.
- Students will not keep cell phones in their desks or in their pockets.
- Students are responsible for their cell phones. No Sherwood Park staff or faculty member will be responsible for a cell phone belonging to a student.
- Upon the first violation of the cell phone policy, the teacher will turn the phone over to an office staff member and notify the parent/guardian that they may pick the phone up.
- A second violation of the cell phone policy will result in the phone being held in the office until the end of the school year. The phone can then be retrieved by the parent/guardian. All cell phone privileges for that student will be revoked for the remainder of the school year.
